Sermon: Righteous, Anointed, Beloved. (Matthew 3:13–17)

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

What happens after Christmas?

Jesus grew in stature, and was baptised before he began the ministry His Father has given him.

Baptism isn't solely about cleansing us from sin.

Baptism is about initiation into community with God and one another, and Jesus shows us the way into this community through his baptism.

This was a beginning moment for the ministry that Jesus would perform. This was a sign that something new was about to be launched, and this new thing was nothing less than the kingdom of God, nothing less than a new way of living in community.

Righteousness refers to being faithful to relationships. You cannot be righteous by yourself. You are righteous with God and righteous with one another. Righteousness implies a relationship.

Baptism is a corporate act; it is almost always done as a part of worship. When, in extreme cases, it is not a part of a regular worship service, then the community must be represented.

Baptism is an entrance into the fellowship of believers; it is joining with the body. Once you have been baptized, you are never alone. There is always a family around you. You have joined something larger than yourself, which is sometimes startling, but always worthwhile.

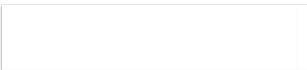

Rev Lim Jen Huat | Ephesians 1:3-4

Summary | Paul's letter to the Ephesians starts with a thanksgiving prayer. The 12 verses in today's text is actually one long sentence in Greek.

The phrase "In Christ" appears eight times in these verses, indicating the centrality of Christ in the life of a Christian. Being "in Christ" must affect how we think, decide, behave and speak. Some think that when we reach the pearly gates of Heaven, the passport to entry is whether we have said the sinner's prayer or if we have been baptised. But Paul reminds us that the most essential point is whether we are "in Christ". Just as a marriage certificate or living under the same roof does not make a marriage, so also church membership or church attendance are no assurance of our salvation. Critically, are we "in Christ" or not? As we receive Holy Communion – in receiving and feeding on the Body of Christ – we pray that God would fill, nourish, sustain and transform us in Christ.

Spiritual Blessings

God has chosen us. This was not an afterthought after the Jews rejected the Lord. Rather, even "before the creation of the world" (vs.4), God chose us. It is an amazing fact that we are so valued and loved by God. We are His special possession.

Christ has redeemed us. Through His death on the cross, Christ has paid for our sins and redeemed us. Our past failures are no longer obstacles to commune with God. 2 Cor. 5:17 declares "if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!". We can start anew in Christ.

The Holy Spirit assures us. The Spirit is God's pledge to us (vs. 13,14). He is the guarantor of the covenant God has made with us. We are marked as God's people. As the Holy Spirit dwells in us, we are assured of our status in Christ. "The Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship...the Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children" (Rom.6:15-16).

Chosen by the Father, redeemed by the Son and assured by the Holy Spirit – what tremendous spiritual blessings we have.

Right response to each blessing

Vs 6, 12 and 14 echo the appropriate response we ought to give to the spiritual blessings we have received, namely, to live for the praise of His glory. As we start the new year, whether in anticipation of good outcomes or living with trials and challenges, will we live for His praise? Let us offer ourselves as a living sacrifice (Rom. 12:1), asking God to fill us so that we can truly live to His glory.

Summary |

Redeemed for His Glory

The redemptive work of God reflects His glory and involves all persons in the Holy Trinity.

- Chosen by the Father to be children of God (v3-6) – our identity
- Redeemed by Jesus for holy witness (v7-12) – our purpose
- Sealed by the Holy Spirit (v13-14) – our guarantee

Why does God want us to glorify Him?

- Praise is not a one-sided affair. "We delight to praise what we enjoy... the delight is incomplete till it is expressed (to each other)." C. S. Lewis, *Reflections on the Psalms*
- When we praise God, we are responding to God's overflowing grace. Our reciprocal praise brings our relationship with God to its fullness and anchors our hearts to God.
- This extends beyond worship songs and includes every dimension of our lives such as our relationships, work and recreation.

How God's blessings S.E.E.P out of us

1. **Sin**
 - o An ongoing unhealthy habit that we are unable to break
 - o A memory of unresolved sins that return to shame us

These sinful attachments make us lose alignment with God's grace in our lives.

2. **Events that involve loss**
 - o Related to performance failures e.g. performance appraisals, report cards
 - o Death, divorce, change or a painful disease that we or our loved ones are going through

These events make us feel lousy and if we cling on to them, hopelessness is allowed to set in. This pulls us away from focusing on God and His promises.

3. **Exhaustion**
Given the increasing fast pace of life and high expectations to perform, no one is spared from the challenge of exhaustion. When life becomes overwhelming, we feel defeated and disconnected. Our tank becomes too empty to follow God, and it becomes hard to trust Him.

Physical, emotional or mental burnout also happens when we cannot say 'no' to ourselves such as:

- we toy with the idea that we are superhumans and have difficulty in saying 'no'
- we have divided hearts and desire the false freedom of more choices

– "by barraging ourselves with so many choices, we get so decision-fatigued that we're unable to choose anything well... we're extremely susceptible to letting other people make our decisions for us." Justin Whitmel Earley, *The Common Rule: Habits of Purpose for an Age of Distraction*

4. **People who are toxic**
Emotionally unhealthy relationships can drain us. Without a strong circle of friends and family to guide and affirm, challenges unsettle us more than they should.

Means of Grace

We need spiritual habits as the means of grace for constant alignment of our lives with God's grace.

"Our practice of the means of grace over time allows grace to wear grooves into our souls... The means of grace work on us (the same way) practising free throws works on a basketball player... (he) becomes a better free-throw shooter through regular practice... gets ingrained into his muscle memory." Andrew Thompson, *The Means of Grace*

Habits to Embrace: Consider habits that enable us to embrace God more fully each day

"In the habits of embrace, we try to train our bodies and our hearts to love God as he actually is and to turn to our neighbor as we were made to do." *Habits to Embrace* – Justin Whitmel Earley

E.g. studying scripture and allowing God's Word to shape our souls, attending a small group, or committing to a 'holy hour' of conversation with a Christian friend on a regular basis which involves a rhythm of ECA: Encouragement, Confession and Accountability.

Habits to Resist

"When we practice resistance, we acknowledge that evil and suffering are very real... Should we do nothing, we will be taught to love the very things that tear us apart." (Justin Whitmel Earley)

1. Isolation – withdrawal from the godly community that God has surrounded us with to sustain us
2. Distraction – activities that drown out God's gentle voice
3. Shame – living with a sense of condemnation instead of a life of freedom

Consider Sabbath-keeping as an embrace and a resistance

- o Pause to be still before God
- o Ponder on God's word
- o Pray for others around us

As a habit of holy embrace

- o Embracing God's joy through play
- o Embracing God's love through family
- o Embracing God's presence through prayer

As a habit of holy resistance

- o Resisting the tyranny of productivity and the illusion of omnipresence
- o Resisting relational neglect

We must resist allowing work or other activities to crowd out our relationship with God and people.

God's Word tells us that we are "marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people". (Eph 1:13-14 NSRVue)

- o **Seal** – a mark of God's ownership, authority, protection and identity
- o **Pledge** – downpayment; promise, a guarantee from God

We are chosen by the Father, redeemed by Jesus and with a future guaranteed by the seal of the Holy Spirit. As such, let us consider how we can daily align to God's grace.

Unless we live from God's grace, we can't live for God's glory.

Knowing God with Heart and Mind

Requirements

- Although you will be reading Scripture, this is NOT strictly Bible Study. This is a study of biblical doctrines that requires a good understanding of the Bible.
- Eligible participants are expected to have graduated from **a minimum of 3 DISCIPLE Bible Study phases**.
- 32 Weekly Sessions via ZOOM
- Be prepared to commit at least 45 minutes each day, six days a week, for reading and studying, taking notes and prayer.
- Your key texts are the Bible, Study Manual and Book of Readings (which comprises key statements of Christian writings from theologians and church council).

Overview of Revelation (D)

*The Tribulation (Rev 4-19)

Rev 11: The Two Witnesses: John was given a reed to measure the **temple of God**, the **altar** and its **worshippers**. The outer court was excluded because it had been given to the **Gentiles**, who would trample on the holy city for **42 months**. God will appoint **2 Witnesses** ("2 olive trees and 2 lampstands" that stand before the Lord of the earth). They will have power to devour their enemies with **fire**, stop the **rain**, turn waters into **blood** and strike the earth with **plagues**.

NB: This **temple** will be in Jerusalem during the 7-year Tribulation. God measures/takes note of the faithful **worshippers**. The miraculous ministry of the 2 Witnesses will extend for **1,260 days/42 weeks/3.5 years**. (during the 1st half of Tribulation). Their powers resemble those of Elijah (fire, rain) and Moses (blood, plagues).

When they have "**finished**" their testimony, the beast (Anti-Christ) from the Abyss will kill them. Their bodies will lie in the public square/street of the "great city" (Jerusalem) for 3.5 days, where people from **every language/nation** will gloat over them, sending one another **gifts**, in **celebration**. But after 3.5 days, **God** will give them **life** and they will stand up, and in response to a "loud voice" from heaven saying "**Come up here**", they will go up to heaven in "the" (not "a") cloud /glory of God, while their terrified enemies looked on!

At that very hour, a **severe earthquake** occurred and 1/10th of Jerusalem collapsed, killing 7,000 people. The terrified **survivors gave glory to God**.

NB: (1) **God's obedient servants** are **immortal/invincible** till their work is done. Only **when God permits**, they were killed and the **whole world** gloated over their bodies (eg. TV, social media, accessible to billions), celebrating with gifts! (an "AntiChrist"-mas celebration. The only celebration mentioned in the Tribulation). After 3.5 days, with their terrified enemies looking on, 2 dead bodies rose to their feet and ascended to heaven, in "a/the" cloud of glory, in response to **God's call**. Believers are assured of **vindication** by God and should **listen for God's voice/commands**. (End of 2nd Woe)

(2) **God was glorified!** But will all **repent and believe/trust in Christ**?

Rev 11: The 7th Trumpet: When sounded, loud voices in heaven announced that the world had become the **Kingdom of Christ who will reign forever**. The 24 elders worshiped God and thanked Him for:

- (1) reigning over **all nations** (which were angry, wanting their own way)
- (2) judging the (wicked) dead and rewarding His **servants/prophets** and those who revere Him (**righteous**), both **great and small** (irrespective of **status, wealth**...) and
- (3) destroying those who **destroy the earth**.

Then **God's temple in heaven** was opened and the **Ark of His Covenant** was seen, inside it! – followed by lightning, thunder, earthquake and hailstorm. **

** (Reminiscent of the **Presence of God** at Mt Sinai!) (Exod 19:16-19)

NB: (3rd Woe) **The 7th Trumpet brought 3 significant events.**

- (1) **Announcement of Imminent Reign of Christ (over the world)**
- (2) **Praise of the Elders**
- (3) **Assurance of God's Presence/Faithfulness (Appearance of Ark)**

***Christ**, rules **today** over a **spiritual kingdom** (in the hearts of true believers). In future, He will reign supremely, over the **nations** of the world, with a **rod of iron**. (Psalm 2:9: with Absolute Authority, resulting in **worldwide Peace, Plenty, and Divine Justice**.) (I.e. The **answer** to (your) **prayer**: "Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on Earth as it is in heaven.") (Matt 6:10) This is when God reclaims His Creation from Satan. (Rev 12-22)

Wesley WSCS

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6 (NKJV)

*Those who “**destroy the earth**”:

- (1) **physically: neglect responsible stewardship, and exploit/mismanage** the Earth’s **God-given** resources.
Result: Air/water pollution, climate change, global warming . . . loss of biodiversity/soil health, deforestation . . . which deprive current and future generations of natural resources for sustaining life! **Yet** many who care for the environment/the Earth, do not “care” to acknowledge its **Creator**!
- (2) **morally: introduce corruption of minds** with superstitions, idolatry, false teachings; **corruption of bodies** with immoral practices; **violence; where every intent of the heart was evil.** (Gen 6:5)

*The Tabernacle was a “copy” of the Temple in heaven. (Heb 9:23)

- (1) The **Ark** contains **God’s Law** (The **10 Commandments**) which would have been neglected during the AntiChrist’s/beast’s influence during the first 3.5 years of Tribulation, when the 2 Witnesses were preaching.
- (2) The **Ark’s Mercy Seat** (cover/lid) is where the sacrificial blood was sprinkled on the Day of Atonement, for the forgiveness of sins.
- (3) The **Ark** reminds believers of **God’s Presence and Faithfulness. Its appearance indicates that access to God (Holy of Holies) is open to the Faithful Followers of Christ.** This reminder comes just before the final judgment events of the 7th Trumpet, giving believers, assurance.

Rev 12: The Woman: A great sign appeared in heaven:

- *A woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. (**Israel**)
- *She gave birth to a son, a male child, who “will rule all the nations with an iron sceptre.” (**Messiah! Jesus! Christ!**)
- *And her child was snatched up to God and to his throne. (**Ascension**)

(Welcome to our world! * Praise the Lord, for Your victory!)

“The kings of the earth prepare for battle; . . .
against the Lord and against His anointed one;
But the One who rules in heaven laughs. . . .

Submit to God’s royal Son, . . .
What **joy** for all who take refuge in him! ”

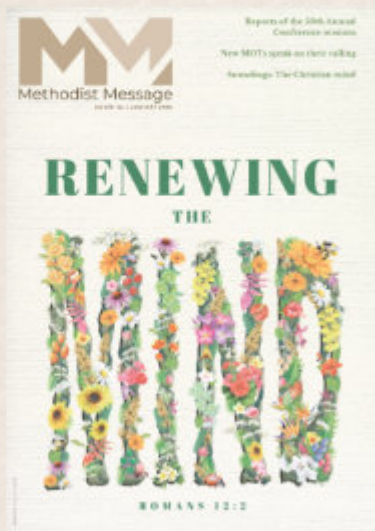

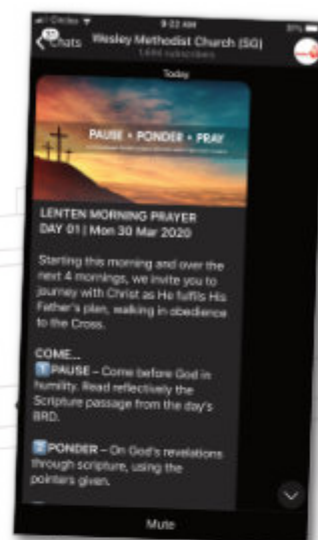
