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Advent – A Season of Waiting and Faithful Anticipation

Advent (from the Latin *adventus*, meaning “coming” or “arrival”) is the four-week season of preparation for the coming of Jesus at Christmas. Advent also begins the church’s new liturgical year. A good celebration requires proper preparation for us to fully enjoy it. During December, however, we mostly confuse helpful readiness for the hustle of Christmas shopping, parties, and preparations. The Advent season, more *reflective* in nature, can feel out of sync with all this noise and busyness.

John the Baptist is the anti-Santa needed for our day. Trade the jolly laugh for an in-your-face intensity, the twinkle in the eye for a wildness about to interrupt your life, commanding our attention but always redirecting it towards Jesus. “**Prepare the way for the Lord**” is the Advent call to get ready for the coming Messiah.

But how do you prepare for a surprise? More than just remembering Christ’s first arrival, **Advent hopes for Christ’s second coming**. Advent is a season of *expectant waiting*, tapping into the sense we have that all is not well, the longing for the world to be made right again. It is a season for restless hearts and people weary of a broken world who want, with all our being, to know there’s more than this.

Advent cultivates in us a discerning eye, helping us to spot the sin that clutters our lives and notice all the ways we need to be saved. By helping us to hope intensely for restoration, to feel our own need to be saved, Advent **prepares us for genuine Christmas joy and faith** in the One who saves us from our sin, Jesus.

Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve.

Candle Lighting

During the four Sundays in Advent, we progressively light the Advent wreath to symbolize our journey through Advent as we await in anticipation for the Lord’s coming.

First Sunday	: Hope
Second Sunday	: Peace
Third Sunday	: Joy
Fourth Sunday	: Love

Colour for Advent

Purple is the primary colour of Advent symbolizing royalty. Purple is also the colour for Lent symbolizing penitence, pointing to an important connection between Jesus’ birth and death.

Lamenting In Trust

Rev Chia Chin Nam | Psalm 13

Summary | When you think about laments, do you see a picture of the sun setting into the mountains, or rising from them? May we, as a Wesley family stand in solidarity with our Brothers and Sisters-in-Christ who are in the dark valleys – now and always see the sun rising from the mountains, as we lament with them before the Risen Son of God, Jesus.

Psalm 13 teaches us about *enduring* prayer that

- **expresses bold, brutally honest complaints and protests to God** – “How long, Lord? Will You forget me forever? How long must I wrestle with my thoughts? How long will my enemy triumph over me?” (v1-2)
- **urgently petitions** – “Look on me and answer, Lord my God. Give light to my eyes. Or my foes will rejoice when I fall.” (v3-4)
- **positively expresses trust and praise** – “I trust in Your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in Your salvation. (You have) been good to me.” (v5-6)

1. **How Long Do We Wait** – for God’s deliverance from depression, forsakenness, abandonment, defeat, anxiety, and fear of death? Hymns like *Precious Lord, Take My Hand* and *I Need Thee Every Hour*, written with deep vulnerability, inspire God’s people to entrust themselves to Christ alone, so that they are mysteriously moved from despair to hope by God’s glory and sovereignty. The song *How Long, O Lord, How Long?* (based on Psalm 13 | <https://youtu.be/tT4RFGzheN0>) parallels the psalmist’s repeated refrain and offers a faith-based reply. “On our knees we pray... through feeble faith and tears... **Till Your glory fills our eyes, and our faith is turned to sight; till our thirsty souls are satisfied.**” How long before we are rescued?

- a. Till we see God’s glory in our suffering
- b. Till by faith in Christ we see beyond ourselves, embrace God’s purposes in our pain
- c. Till our souls are satisfied in Christ alone, and suffering can be endured a little longer

2. **How Should We View Biblical Lament?** Is it right to lament since God’s promises are ultimately fulfilled in Christ? Is it appropriate to complain to God when Paul admonishes us to “Rejoice in the Lord always” (Philippians 4:4)?

- a. Complaint (13:1-2) – In lamenting, the psalmist shows his **unwavering faith in God**. David trusted absolutely in God’s covenant promises, so he prayed them back to God. He waited expectantly even as he complained.
 - Will the Lord forget me forever? No! “The Lord Himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you.” (Deuteronomy 31:8)
 - Will God hide His face from me? No! “I will no longer hide my face from them, for I will pour out My Spirit on the people of Israel.” (Ezekiel 39:29)

God has allowed lament psalms to fill almost half the Psalter. Jesus taught us, “Blessed are those who mourn for they will be comforted.” He exposed His emotions – weeping at the tomb of His friend Lazarus, and over the unbelief of Jerusalem. He lamented to His Father and grieved to the point of death in the Garden of Gethsemane, and then on the cross, “My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?” Let us therefore gratefully accept God’s permission to freely express to Him our emotions and complaints, trustingly.

- b. **Petition** (v3-4) – As maturing Christians, we should **regard God’s work in our lives with humility**, knowing that His way is not our way. Like the psalmist in Psalm 139 who surrendered his anguished desperation to the God who “fearfully and wonderfully” made him, along with all God’s “wonderful” works – be assured that God has not forgotten or forsaken us, then state our prayer requests boldly.

Like David, let us proceed to petition God to renew our strength (“give light to my eyes”) so we can face our enemies (13:3-4) – spiritual, emotional or physical.

- c. **Trust** (v5-6) – Confidently declare our trust in **God’s hesed love** that is unfailing, steadfast, merciful and lovingly kind. In Psalm 119:75-76, the psalmist called on God to comfort him with His steadfast love (hesed), knowing that God’s rules are righteous, and that his affliction was the result of God’s faithfulness, not His abandonment.

From complaining, we can move to petitioning and praising God unreservedly; expecting His glory to shine in our trials. It is the redemptive work of Christ that heals and convinces us of God’s sovereignty and goodness even though we may feel undeserving. Trust in Jesus’ words to Peter, “You do not realise now what I am doing, but later you will understand.” (John 13:7) We are comforted to stand on God’s reliable promises, to rejoice in our salvation through His mercy and grace.

Disciples In Worship

Rev Lilian Ang | Psalm 95

Summary | "All that God does is done well!" This understanding comes from the Talmud, a central text of Rabbinic Judaism and second in authority only to the Hebrew Bible. We should keep this thought in mind as we enter to worship the Lord. Let us be thankful for all that God has done for us! In Psalm 95 we see three very clear commands of worship.

A) Grateful Rejoicing (Psalm 95:1–7)

In Wesley Sanctuary the traditional worship service starts with a 'Call to Worship'. In verses 1 and 6 we see the command 'Come!'. The people of God are called to assemble for the purpose of worship and joyfully and loudly sing his praise. We can be wholehearted and unashamed because we remember that God is our refuge and rescuer. He is worthy of our worship! This is an activity we should enter into intentionally and not drift into church preoccupied and distracted. True worship must be authentic. Verses 3 and 7 give us the reasons why we worship. He is a great God and a great king; he is the creator and sustainer. In verses 4–5 we learn that God is in control and the owner; he created everything whether mountains, sea or dry land. We are created by the hand of God and also sustained by the hand of God. Worship does not come naturally and requires effort. We must humble ourselves and make confessions asking for forgiveness before we worship. If we do not prepare our hearts we cannot expect to encounter God. Worship services are not meant for us to sit back and enjoy but for us to make every effort to prepare ourselves to meet God! Being a few minutes early would give us time to quieten down, reflect, thank God and pray a simple prayer to ask him to help us be ready to hear his Word.

B) Greater Reverence (Psalm 95:6–7b)

In these verses we see the same basic elements such as command to worship and reasons for praise. Joy is succeeded by awe as we encourage each other to bow before him. The three verbs in verse 6 – worship, bow and kneel – paint a picture of getting low before God. We surrender and submit which is the correct posture for the 'created' before the 'creator'. In return God extends personal care. We are the sheep of his hand (verse 7). We should not focus on what we get out of church but on what we can give to God. Note the change of tone as the psalm progresses from standing in God's presence with loud and joyful rejoicing to bowing before him with awe-inspired reverence! Our posture and hearts change from praise to prostration. The words 'Our Maker' in verse 6 refer to God being the one who made Israel his own special people and therefore made us his own personal flock. Our creator is also intimately related to us as our redeemer. How is my posture before the Lord this morning? What am I modelling to my children? It would be good for our families to join us in worship services. We can all reflect on how we can be more intentional and reverent as we come to worship services with less chit-chat and checking our phones and more thought given to the one we come to honour.

C) Genuine Response (Psalm 95:7c–11)

In verses 1–7 we have the 'what' (joyful singing), 'why' (he is our great God) and 'how' (in surrender and submission) of worship. In verses 8–11 the author moves from worship to warning. We are reminded that worship is never meant to be a mindless activity and a genuine response is one of obedience. If we retain hard and disobedient hearts we have not surrendered and cannot respond genuinely. The psalmist is considering the challenge of obedience and recalls Meribah (dispute) and Massah (testing) which brings to mind the Israelites in the wilderness and how they rebelled against God and caused Moses to be banned from entering the Promised Land (Exodus 17:1–17). The two names link two crisis situations that the Israelites found themselves in. The Israelites would not trust God for his presence or provision. How are our hearts? Do we trust God fully? Delayed obedience is disobedience. Are we training our children to obey? Without obedience there is no true discipleship. The Bible says that God will loathe us and be grieved by our disobedience and we will forfeit his blessings. Hebrews 3:7 speaks to us in the present tense urging us 'TODAY' to hear his voice and avoid hardening our hearts. When our worship grows stale so does our passion for Christ. Today is the last day of the liturgical year and known as Christ the King Sunday. We acknowledge that everything in creation and culture must submit to Christ! Let us accept this invitation to actively and joyfully submit to Christ's rule taking the opportunity to re-align and re-submit ourselves to the full lordship of Christ.

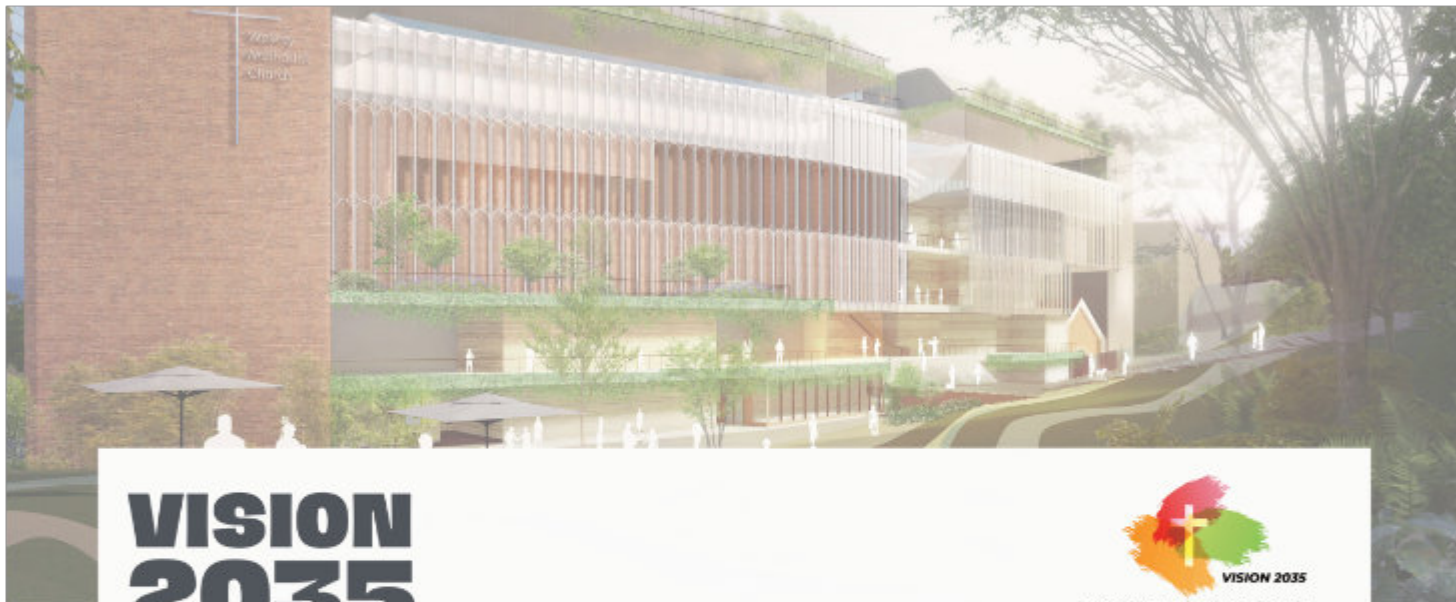

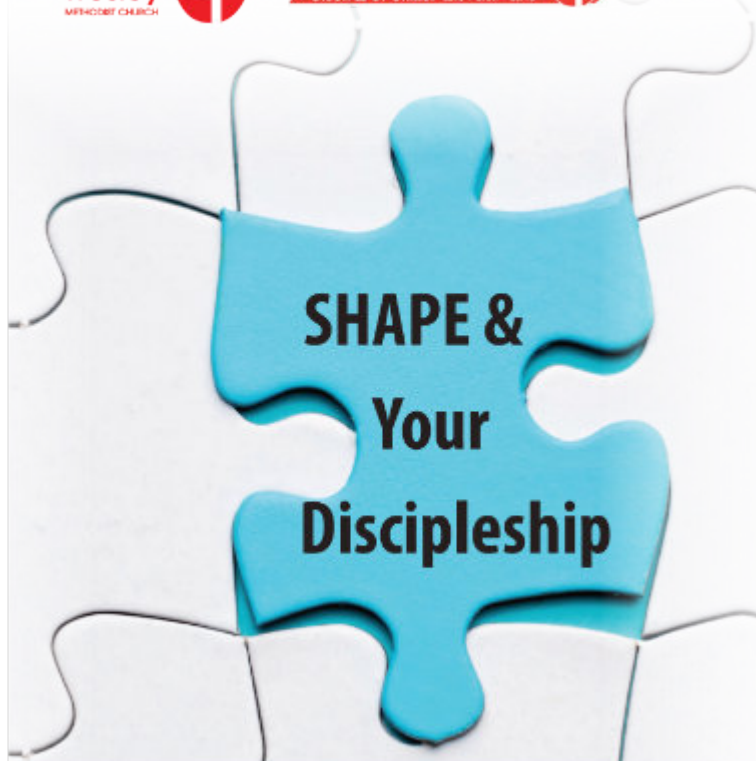

- Made up of individuals who study each day about prayer, scripture, and discernment, and who keep a personal journal of their learning and reflections.
- A small group of people that meets weekly to support one another and share life journeys authentically without fear of being judged.

The Companions in Christ journey comprises 28 sessions over eight months:

2. Embracing the Journey: The Way of Christ	(5 sessions)
3. Feeding on the Word: The Mind of Christ	(5 sessions)

6. Exploring Spiritual Guidance: The Spirit of Christ	(5 sessions)
7. Closing Retreat: Developing a Rule of Life	(Final session)

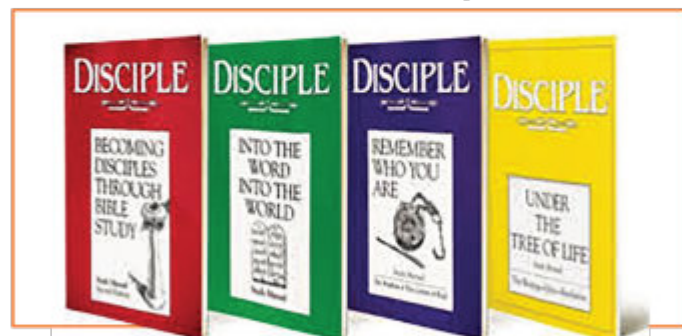

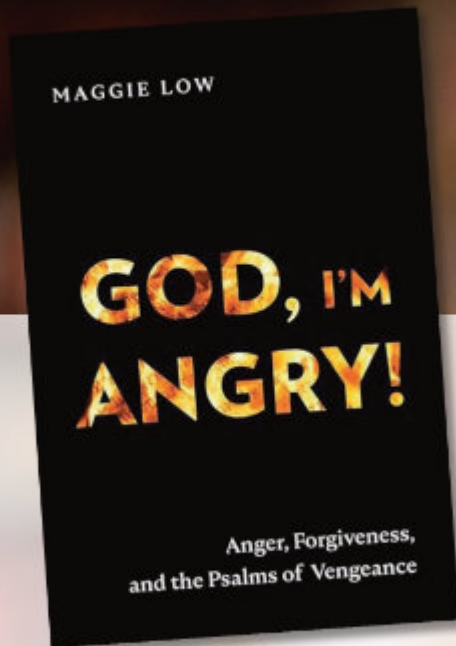

BookNook HIGHLIGHTS

She surveys five NT texts which show that forgiveness is actually conditional: See the Lord's Prayer, the healing of the paralytic, the woman caught in adultery, the crucifixion of Jesus, and Paul's exhortation to forgive one another.

Dr Low next examines five texts that make repentance explicitly necessary for forgiveness. They demonstrate that God does care about justice and righteousness. Her survey of a number of texts in the Old Testament bears this out even more clearly.

But what if the offender is unrepentant? How should we respond? Dr Low takes two chapters to unravel this. First she looks at vengeance and the love for an enemy in the O.T. This ethic is further developed in the N.T. Not everyone might agree with Maggie Low's interpretation of the Sermon of the Mount, esp. about not retaliating when slapped. (Mt 5:38-48). What to do then with Jesus's command to love our enemies? The writer points out that Jesus was primarily concerned with the tendency of his contemporaries to pervert the law in order to exact vengeance and to justify hatred. She concludes that the hope of divine vengeance enables a believer to return good for evil.

That brings her to the Psalms, where we find a number of disturbing passages that call on God to exact vengeance on enemies. How can we pray these psalms? Maggie Low stresses that we must understand the theology behind this, and shows that there is a place for these psalms. They may have great value in counselling people who have been deeply hurt.

This is not an easy book, not only because of the sensitive subject, but also because chapters 7 to 11 are quite demanding. But those who persevere and take their time to work through its pages will be richly rewarded.

Here we have the review on the book written by Maggie Low on - God, I'm Angry!

God, I'm Angry! – Anger, Forgiveness and the Psalms of Vengeance by Maggie Low
(Available at BookNook @ \$25.00)

I'll be honest, it was the screaming title that first attracted me to this book. Not many Christian writers dare to address such a theme; yet we are all familiar with anger, even in its mildest form of irritation with the behaviour of others. Dr Maggie Low is a faculty member of Trinity Theological College. So it was not a surprise to find this book quite scholarly in tone, with ample footnotes at the bottom of the page. But don't let that frighten you away!

First she tackles the question: "Is it OK to be angry?" She gives quite a number of examples from the Bible and concludes: Not all anger is wrong, and Paul even commands us to be angry in Ephesians 4:25! It is, however, tempered by the word: "but do not sin". Anger can be legitimate, and we have a few examples from the life of Jesus Himself.

Is forgiveness conditional or unconditional? I always thought that, ideally, it should be unconditional. But the book demonstrates convincingly that it is not so simple. Is the offender ready to repent?

Overview of Revelation (B)

John was instructed to write: (Rev 1:19)

- A. The things which you have seen (Past)
The Risen Christ among the 7 Churches. (Rev 1)
- B. The things which are (Present)
Christ's letters to the 7 Churches. (Rev 2,3)
- C. The things which will take place. (Future)
*The Tribulation (Rev 4-19)
*The Millennium (Rev 20)
*All Things New (Rev 21-22)

***The Tribulation (Rev 4-19)**

Rev 4: The Throne in Heaven:

John saw a door in heaven, heard a voice ("Come up here...") and was transported "in the Spirit" to the **"Throne in Heaven"** with someone sitting on it, appearing like jasper (reddish-brown/yellow) and ruby (red precious stone). A green **rainbow** encircled the throne, from which came lightning and thunder. In front of it was what looked like a sea of crystal-clear glass.

Around the throne were **24 elders** dressed in white, with crowns of gold. There were also **4 living creatures**, each looking like a lion, ox, face of a man and a flying eagle. Each had 6 wings and were covered with eyes, even under their wings!

NB: (1) The **24 elders**, reminiscent of the 12 tribes and 12 apostles, may symbolise all who belong to the family of God (Jews and Gentiles). In their hymn, they extol God, who created everything (!) in accordance with His Will. (4:11)

(2) The **4 living creatures** are angelic beings who (1) lead others in **worship** (2) proclaim God's holiness (3) help implement God's justice. Their appearance may symbolise God's attributes of majesty/power, faithfulness, intelligence and sovereignty respectively. (ref: lion, ox, man, eagle). They may also represent the ministry of Christ as King (Gospel of Matthew), Servant (Mark), Man (Luke) and God (John).

(3) **Worship** takes our minds off our earthly problems and helps us to **focus** on our loving, heavenly Father and Saviour, our Refuge and Strength.

Rev 5: The Scroll and the Worthy Lamb

John wept because no-one in heaven or on earth was worthy to open the **Scroll with 7 Seals**, on the right hand of the One on the throne. However, one of the elders pointed out that the **Lion of the tribe of Judah**, the **Root of David**, had triumphed... He was worthy to open the Scroll. John saw a **Lamb, looking as if it had been slain**. The Lamb took the Scroll from the One on the throne, and the 24 elders and the 4 living creatures sang a new song, praising the **Lamb's work**: His death, redemption of persons from **every tribe, language, race and nation** with his **blood**, to be a **Kingdom of Rulers and Priests**. The elders were holding **golden bowls** full of incense, which are the **prayers** of God's people.

NB: (1) The **Scroll** contains God's Final Judgment/End-Time events. Only One person is morally and legally worthy to judge ie. the **Lamb of God who still bore the marks of sacrifice and redemption, before the Throne of God**. The Lamb's **7 horns** symbolise omnipotence and the **7 eyes** symbolise omniscience/knowledge/wisdom. **And this Lamb, is alive and standing!**

(2) **Judah** was the 4th of the 12 sons of Jacob/Israel. It was from this kingly tribe that King David and the Messiah (Christ) came. Because Jesus is divine (God), He is both the **Root** (source) and the descendant/Son of David.

(3) Do not be biased, but share the Gospel with **all** peoples and nations.

(4) The church of redeemed believers will help to **rule** in the Kingdom. As **priests**, they have **direct access to God**.

(5) **The golden bowls indicate how precious the prayers of Christians are, as they rise like incense, to God Most High upon His Throne.**

Then John looked and heard myriads ("ten thousands times ten thousands") of **angels** encircling the throne saying: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power, wealth, wisdom, strength, honour, glory and praise." A tribute to the Son, the Redeemer.

Then **every creature** in heaven, on earth, under the earth, on the sea and "all that is in them", praised both Him who sits on the throne and the Lamb.

The 4 creatures said "Amen" and the elders fell in worship.

NB: (1) The entire Creation was united in adoration – attributing honour, glory and power to both the One on the throne and to His Son.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6 (NKJV)

Rev 6: The 7 Seals (including the 4 Horsemen) (Rev 6:1-8)

The Lamb opened the 1st 4 Seals, one by one. Each time, one of the 4 living creatures said: "Come", to reveal the:

"Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse":

1. **White Horse:** Its rider (likely the Anti-Christ; a false imitation of Christ. Christ is depicted on a white horse in Rev 19:11) held a bow (no arrows), and he was given a "crown", riding out as a "conqueror" of the world, as a peaceful leader. **(Conquest)**
(NB: His "crown" (Gk: stephanos in Rev 6:2) is not the same as the crown (Gk: diadem) of the Word of God and King of kings in Rev 19:12).
2. **Fiery Red Horse:** Its rider was given power to take peace from the earth and to make people kill each other. He was given a large sword. **(War)**
(NB: After 3.5 years of peace, the Anti-Christ will wage open warfare.)
3. **Black Horse:** Its rider was holding a pair of scales. There will be scarcity/shortage of wheat and barley, so their prices could be increased by 8-10 times. (Inflation of food prices). A day's wage – 1 denarius – can only buy enough wheat for 1 person or enough of the less nutritious barley for 3 persons. So workers will have difficulty feeding their families. **(Famine)**
(NB: However, a voice from the 4 living creatures had instructed that the supply of luxury items of oil and wine will not be affected. Only the grain/staples will be affected.)
4. **Pale/Ashen Horse: (Yellowish Green Horse)** Its rider was the only one named: "Death", not a human. And Hades (the abode of the dead/souls) was following close behind. They were given power over one fourth (1/4) of the earth, to kill by sword, famine, plague and wild beasts. **(Death)**
(NB: God was still limiting the harm/destruction inflicted. He was still giving survivors, a chance to repent.)
5. The Lamb opened the **5th Seal**, and John saw under the altar, the souls of **martyrs** who had been slain because of the **word of God** and the **testimony they had maintained**. They called out: "How long, **Sovereign Lord**, ... until you judge the inhabitants of the earth and avenge our blood?" Each was given a white robe and they were told to wait a little longer, until their "**full number**" had been reached.
(NB: These martyrs were **faithful witnesses**. They may have been saved after the Rapture of the church, but killed during the Tribulation. They are in heaven! God has His plan and best timing. Justice will eventually prevail, in **His** good time.)
6. The opening of the **6th Seal** brought universal chaos to the **whole world!**
There was a great earthquake, the sun turned black, the moon turned blood red, the stars fell to the earth, the heavens rolled up like a scroll and every mountain and island was displaced!!
All unrepentant humanity – irrespective of status: kings, princes, generals, the rich, the mighty, as well as the slave and free, will hide in desperation in caves and call in sheer terror, for an avalanche from the mountains and rocks to fall on them. ...to hide them from: "**the face of Him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb!**" They will know that the "great day of their wrath has come," and who can survive it? **(But: The child of God knows her loving Father and gentle Saviour will protect/shelter her under His wings, and grant refuge within His Everlasting Arms. She will be spared.)**
NB: Those who trust in Jesus as Saviour need not be afraid.
Others should not delay/put off repenting of their sins and receiving Him as their Saviour and Lord.

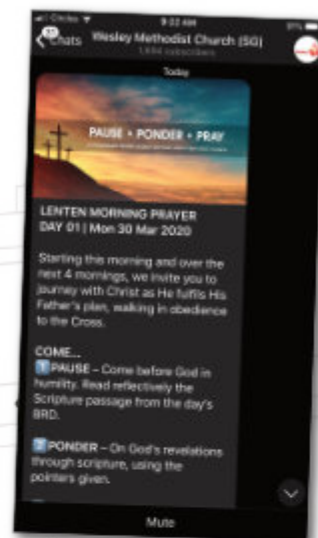

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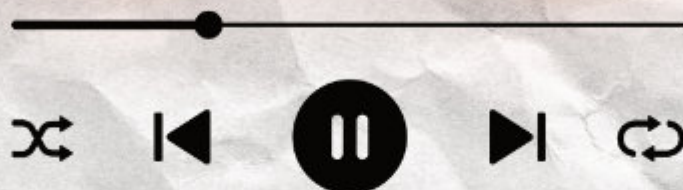
