





# TRADITIONAL WORSHIP SERVICES 27 Apr 2025 There Is A River Rev Dr Isaac Lim | Ezekiel 47:1-12

Summary | Ezekiel sees a vision of a river starting from the temple of God. It flows into desert lands, transforming the landscape into a beautiful flourishing one. This is a picture of the church which blesses the community, nation and world. We, the church, are God's gift to the world. Wesley Methodist Church's Vision 2035, through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, seeks to be a welcoming church that makes disciples and serves the least, last and lost in the community and beyond. Zech. 4:6 reminds us that only through the power of the Holy Spirit are we able to achieve Vision 2035. As a church, we have experienced God's faithfulness in the past 140 years and the same Holy Spirit will lead us on for the next 140 years.

Source of the River (Eze.47:1-2) — the river Ezekiel sees is no ordinary one. It has an unusual source, namely, the temple of God. Using the same metaphor, Jesus says "rivers of living water will flow from within them" (John 7:38). The Lord was referring to the Holy Spirit which believers will receive. It is the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Christians that will enable them to be conduits of God's love to the world. In 1 Cor. 3:16-17 and 1 Cor. 6:15, Paul reminds us that we are the temple of the Holy Spirit. Wherever we go, the river of life flows, to bless all those we encounter.

Depth of the River (Eze.47:3-6) —Every 500 metres along the river, the depth is measured and each time, it increases. This depicts the spiritual growth of believers and the empowerment to serve God. The Lord gives the Holy Spirit to the disciples even as they start their ministry (John 20:22). Only with the empowerment of the Holy Spirit will we be able to accomplish God's work. The further the river flows, the deeper it gets. Similarly, our influence widens and deepens as we grow in the Spirit. We must be willing to trust Him to work and to go where He leads. We must not simply read the Scriptures but believe and act upon it. We may have academic depth in His Word but not apply what He says. Head knowledge must be turned into transformation of our lives.

Influence of the River — we are called to be salt and light to the world. It is tragic if the church loses its influence and fails to bless the community and the world. 2 Tim. 3:1-5 warns of the danger when the world creeps into the church. Instead of godly influence on the world, we may desire recognition from the world. The speaker testified of his baptism in the Holy Spirit while serving as associate pastor in Wesley Methodist Church in 1978. As he received the anointing to preach and became bold in faith, the church grew both spiritually and numerically. The same can happen again as we step out in faith for Vision 2035. Just as the river transformed the landscape, so also God's presence is carried with us. Whether in professional or social life, we are to bring God's love and hope into the community. The church will overflow, and it will be a joy to rebuild to accommodate the many new believers.

May we be receptive to the Holy Spirit's power to make Vision 2035 a reality.

# PRAYER & PRAISE WORSHIP SERVICES 27 Apr 2025 Entering The Promised Land

Mr Adriel Loh | Joshua 5:13-15; 2:1-13

**Summary** The context of Joshua chapter 5 is that Joshua was standing at the edge of the Promised Land and about to lead the Israelites into battle against the fortified city of Jericho. His heart must have been filled with hopes, dreams and yet uncertainty. We too stand at the edge of our future and contemplate our own personal hopes, dreams and ambitions but also our fears. However, there are two things that can stand in the way of the future that God wants to give to us. The first is our ambition and the second is our fear.

1. Overcoming ambition. Secular wisdom dictates that we need to be powerful to succeed. This is almost satanic in origin as we read in Isaiah 14:12-15 how the heavenly worship leader, the archangel Lucifer (the former name for Satan) craved to be more powerful than God and tried to seize the throne of God with a third of the angels of heaven. But God cast them down to the earth and prepared hell for them. This was the first recorded act of rebellion in biblical history and at its root was pride, envy and ambition. Contrast this with Jesus, who had ultimate power but gave up His right to that power and humbled himself, and became obedient to death, even death on the cross for us. And so God exalted him and lifted him up and gave Him the Name that is above every name that at the name of Jesus every knee would bow. We see two contrasting responses to power — The first is the way of Satan (and the way of the world), that if you want power, you must seize it. The second is the way of Christ. He had who ultimate power but laid it down for us.

In Joshua chapter 5, Joshua meets a heavenly being (the pre-incarnate Christ himself). When asked if He is for or against Joshua, Christ replies "neither", but as the Commander of the Army of the Lord, He had come. He was teaching Joshua an important lesson that Joshua had got it all wrong. It was not Joshua who was in charge. It was not about Joshua's army or strategy. It was not about Joshua. There is only one Commander of the Army of the Lord and He is God himself. God was the one in charge! Joshua understood this and fell on his face and worshipped.

We all want to be in charge, we all want to be the god of our own lives, we all want to be the ones calling the shots. We yearn for power and admiration in all arenas of life, in our offices, in our schools and even in church. We are so easily tempted to seize power if we can. But the God principle that Christ demonstrated on the Cross is that if we give up our power to God, He will give us His power and use us to change the world!

2. Overcoming fear. When US President announced world-wide tariffs on 3 Apr 2025, the stock markets plunged and we entered into an era of uncertainty and fear. US consumer sentiment reached a new low and we now have a massive trade war. We are living in anxious times but we must remember that there is a greater reality, one where God is still on the throne. (Psalm 46:6-7,10). There are two contrasting realities — Our human reality which is based on what we see around us, what the media say and what our leaders say. Then, there is the God's reality, the God reality, reality as God sees it. And in that reality, God is always in control and He is always supreme.

This contrast is seen clearly in Joshua chapter 2. Forty years earlier, the Israelites failed to enter the Promised Land because of their fear. Spies had been sent in to spy out the land. Ten of the spies returned and reported only terrifying obstacles. Compared to the giants of the land which they saw, the Israelites were like grasshoppers in their own eyes. Only Joshua and Caleb saw the promise and but the rest of them only saw the problem. Fast forward 40 years and this time the two spies by Joshua into the Promised Land to spy out the land. They entered into Jericho and encountered a prostitute named Rahab. She hides them in her root and lies to her own king that the spies had left. The reason she did so was because she saw the God reality, that God had given Israel the land and she and her people were doomed to defeat. Ironically, it was the enemies of God that saw the God reality, but 40 years earlier, the Israelites could not see it. They could only see their own human reality. It took an enemy of Israel to open the eyes of the spies to the God reality.

The only way to overcome fear is to move from our human reality to see the God reality. Instead of looking at the problems, we need to look at God. Let us run back to Him and ask Him to show us His reality, so that we can walk by faith and not by sight. Let us stop crying to God about the size of our problems, but start speaking to our problems about the size of our God!

We overcome ambition by knowing the God principle. We overcome fear by seeing the God reality!

# **BookNook** HIGHLIGHTS

HOSPITALITY GROWING the Church

BookNook, a mini-bookshop located opposite the Plaza Hall, sells Christian books, bibles, devotionals, greeting cards and gifts.

Here we have the review on the book written by Reverend Ivan Tan on Hospitality & Growing the Church.

# Reverend Ivan Tan: Hospitality & Growing the Church, 2023 (Available at BookNook @ \$20.00)

There is so much to like about this short but very insightful book. It's less than a hundred pages, but Revd Ivan Tan has packed a lot of very helpful thoughts, reflections and probing questions between its green covers.

Hospitality sounds like a fairly formal word; perhaps we think of hospitals, a hospice, or about the hospitality of a hotel or questhouse. Given the title, we may think it's about welcoming visitors to our church. But it goes much deeper.

At heart, it is part of what Jesus calls the second great commandment: "Love your neighbour as yourself." The earliest Christians were known to practice hospitality to strangers (see Hebrews 13:2). Drawing inspiration from one of his professors at Asbury Theological Seminary, Dr Christine Pohl, pastor Tan shows that hospitality should be extended to those we already know but also to those we have no relationship with. The former strengthens and builds relationships; the latter is a way to welcome the Lord Himself. Re-read Matthew 25! The book gives a very moving example of a stranger who came to Living Hope Methodist Church.

The book has three parts, successively dealing with welcoming strangers, welcoming friends, and the dimension of the family.

For welcoming strangers, a firm biblical foundation is given, together with a good overview of the practice of the early church. Pastor Ivan then delves into the question of who these strangers are. Here too he starts with many biblical examples before bringing it right home to our Singapore context with many helpful examples and practical suggestions for the church.

The section on welcoming friends also starts with the example of Jesus and of the early church. From there we are challenged to look afresh at the ethnic diversity found in our own society, and how our guests can become our friends.

The third part, 'Welcoming Family' builds on the previous two: "In the Christian tradition, hospitality is offered to strangers whom we welcome as our quests. As we get to know them, they become our friends. And over time as they get involved in the life of our church community, they become our family in Christ." (p. 61)

Indeed, the church is 'the household of faith'. Ivan cites our own experience at Wesley in the early 1980's as an example. Many helpful suggestions are offered on how the church can be a more truly welcoming family, including a short biblical overview of the salvation of households in Luke and Acts.

Each section of the book comes with helpful reflection and/or discussion questions. A thoughtful poem, some prayers and a short liturgy are included, as well as a bibiography for those who want to read more on this important topic. Joel Choong provided several illustrations, including a watercolour on the cover. This book is excellent material for small group study, because it keeps the reader going back to the bible and includes helpful questions for small group discussion. Warmly recommended!



# Psalm 103

In this Psalm, David **Praises God** for his **Goodness to us**. No matter what challenges we face in life, we should **Count our Blessings** (past, present, future) and be reminded of **His great Love for us**. In our gratitude, we will be moved to **Praise Him**. (There is **no request** in this Psalm.)

### A) Personal Praise to God: (1-5)

- Bless the Lord, O my soul; And all that is within me, bless His Holy Name!
- Bless the Lord, 0 my soul, And forget not all his benefits:
- Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases,
- Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies,
- 5. Who satisfies your mouth with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the eagles's. (Psalm 103:1-5)

David speaks to his "soul" (emotion/intellect/will of a person as distinct from the body and spirit) to "**Bless**" God, which is to Praise/Exalt/Worship Him — for His holiness (v1) and dominion over all things (v22). God deserves it! We should do so with "all that is within me." (our whole heart).

#### We should Remember all His benefits: (And give Thanks in everything!)

- (a) He forgives all our sins! (Note the greatness of His mercy!)
- (b) He heals all our diseases. Healing may be:
  - Natural: Thanks for our immune system, white blood cells which fight infection, engulf bacteria, produce antibodies; platelets which form clots
    to stop bleeding...
  - Medical: Thanks for doctors, nurses, paramedics, medicines, chemotherapy, vaccines...
  - Supernatural: Divine healing for which there is no scientific explanation.
  - Eternal: Our resurrected bodies will be imperishable, spiritual, raised in glory and power. It will not experience sickness, deterioration, decay, death. It will be immortal. (1 Cor 15:35-54)
- (c) He **rescues** us from destruction (the pit/eternal death).
  - God is our Kinsman-Redeemer/closest relative, who redeems us!
  - Jesus said: "I am the Resurrection and the Life....Whoever believes in Me shall never die." (John 11:25,26) Thank You! For finishing your mission.
- (d) He crowns you with steadfast love and compassion/mercy.
- (e) He satisfies/fills your life with "good things" (God's provision of "good things" could be spiritual or material. He wants us to flourish and is committed to our welfare and joy. "Good" is defined by God's perspective, though many think of wealth and possession. Solomon found that God is the only source of satisfaction/fulfillment!
- (f) He restores our physical strength and health, so that our youth is renewed like the eagle's. \* (Even seniors will find the energy and vitality to do the Lord's will.)

#### B) National Praise to God: (6-18)

The Lord "works"/gives his **Righteousness and Justice** by delivering Israel from oppression in Egypt (Exodus), and by inflicting judgment on Pharoah. (Believers receive Christ's righteousness to be "saved".). He made known **His ways** (reveals His character/guidance) to Moses, **His deeds** to the people of Israel. **God gave Moses His Law (Ten Commandments...** Maker's "Instruction Manual") so they know how to serve Him and follow His teachings. They witnessed His acts (eg parting the Red Sea, leading them through the cloud by day and pillar of fire by night...) God revealed Himself to be **Compassionate** (emotionally involved!), **Gracious** (Merciful, reaching out to us who are undeserving), **Slow to Anger** (restraining just wrath!), **Filled with Unfailing Love**. He does not constantly accuse us, or remain angry forever. He does not treat (punish) us "as our sins deserve". (**Instead He punished His beloved Son – as our sins deserve!**) Reason: As the heavens are high above the earth, **so great is His Love** for **those who fear (revere) Him**.

# MINISTRY PROGRAMME

# Wesley WSCS

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Prov 3:5-6 (NKJV)

He has **removed our sins**, "as far as the East is from the West". Since East and West will never meet, we shall be **forever separated** from our sins, so we should not wallow in the guilt of past wrongs. (eg. abortion)

(cf. On Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, one goat was sacrificed and its blood sprinkled on the Mercy Seat of the Ark of the Covenant in the Holy of Holies. A second goat (Scapegoat) was led into the wilderness, after the High Priest had laid his hands on it, and confessed the sins of the nation. Symbolically, it carried away the sins of Israel. (Lev 16).

NB: Christ is our High Priest, the Sacrificed Lamb and the "Scapegoat".

As a father has compassion (pity) on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear Him. Only those who reverence God will enjoy the tender loving care of our heavenly Father. God knows how we are formed.

("For you formed my inward parts; You knit me together in my mother's womb.")(Psalm 139:13)

He remembers that we are "dust". (He knows how weak and fragile we are.) Our days on earth are transient like "grass" and the "flower" of the field which blooms (flourish for a season) and then dies... not to be remembered, as if they/we had never been here.

But! From everlasting to everlasting (forever, because of our Eternal Life), the Lord's Love is with those who fear Him and His righteousness (Salvation) extends to their children's children. These are those who keep His covenant and obey His precepts (commandments). (NB: God's Blessings upon Israel are conditional/dependent on their Obedience to His Covenant. (17,18)

#### C) Universal Praise to God: (19-22)

The Lord has established His Throne in heaven. From there, He rules Sovereign over all Creation! Even the mighty Angels, who obey Him and implement His plans, are called to Bless/Praise Him. So too, the heavenly hosts (angelic armies) who serve Him and do His will, and all His "works" (all He has created), everything in all His Kingdom. David concluded by voicing His personal Praise.

#### NB: It is our Lord Jesus:

- Who is the reason why God has not dealt with us according to our sins! (10)
- (2) Who knew our frame because He created us from the dust, and experienced our frailty firsthand, while on Earth. (14)
- (3) Who is enthroned in heaven- our Great High Priest, interceding for us! (19)
- 01. List some specific Blessings / Benefits from God upon your life, Will you Bless / Praise the Lord for them?
- Q2. Who will you bless with the Good News of God's Loving Kindness? Pray that God will guide you to tell someone of God's Love for her/him.

"But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength;
